

Golf Managers Report 4th February 2026

Directors Update.

Pre-application public consultation

Following on from the AGM, we can confirm that Blenheim Strategic Partners will shortly begin a two-week pre-application public consultation, with the consultation period likely commencing sometime next week (w/c 09/02/2026)

This public consultation will include a leaflet drop to homes closest to the site, with a consultation website including a freephone number, and an online form inviting feedback from the local community.

This is an expected part of the process and does not reflect any decision by Bromsgrove District Council, nor does it impact the current day-to-day operations of Bromsgrove Golf Centre.

Bromsgrove Golf Centre will continue to operate as normal.

Golf Course Maintenance.

Since the last update the weather has been against us. For the month of January, we had in excess of 130mm of rainfall which has made it extremely difficult to get out onto the golf course with any machinery.

Unfortunately, we have had to close the course on several occasions. This is due to areas on the course, such as the walk from the 2nd green to the 3rd tee, being too wet for safe play.

We finally managed to carry out January's aeration on the playing surfaces, only last week. This involved the normal slit and pro core. I am still hoping to carry out a deeper aeration once conditions allow.

Tree works have continued, this time around the putting green where the works we have done have made a huge difference. Not only have these works been instigated to improve the putting green playing surface, but they have also improved the visuals from the car park out onto the golf course.

My plans going forward [once the weather allows] are to

- Level selected tees as discussed previously
- re-edge all bunkers and top up sand levels where necessary.
- carry out renovations on all tee boxes. This will involve some aeration along with a top dress and a seed so that they are in good condition going into the fast-approaching golf season.

Honours boards

Winners names have now been received, so will now be sent to the sign makers for printing off. As authorised at last month's meeting, four boards will be sent away for new smaller lettering to be attached.

Club Trophies

All trophies have now been returned to the cabinets or on to the various shelving in the bar. A stock check (15/01/2026) was taken and all trophies were present except for the Robert Johnson Memorial Trophy and the Junior Mortek Trophy. I have asked Rob Laing to return these junior Club trophies after the Junior Presentation.

Unfortunately, whilst checking all the trophies back into stock, I'm afraid to report the following damage/breakages were recorded

- Ladies Open Trophy – L/H handle broken off
- TOFFS Vets Men's Single Trophy – Man statue broken off top of cup
- Spring scramble – R/H handle broken off
- Junior Summer Knockout – Loose handle

I can only consider these breakages are through old age and the joins are brittle as I can assure you, they are carefully handled and packed in bubble wrap when put in storage for the winter months.
